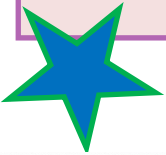

It's an exciting time at Milborne Port Primary School at the moment, as we are developing the school special needs target setting system.

This term we will be continuing to embed the graduated teaching response within the school. What this means for you:

- If your child is on the SEND register, then you will be asked by your child's class teacher to attend a SEND target setting meeting. Please bring your ideas and thoughts regarding your child to the meeting and we can incorporate these in their targets for the spring term.
- We will also be writing one page profiles for your child. We want to know how your child feels about school, what they feel that they are good at, what they love and what they would like more support in. Once these are completed we will send a copy to you so that you can share them at home.
